

ark	A decorative cupboard which holds the Torah.	<p>What is the Torah?</p>  <p>The Torah is the most holy Jewish book. It contains the five books of Moses, the laws for Jews (including the Ten Commandments) and ancient stories. bimah	The platform where the Torah is read.		
chuppah	A canopy under which a Jewish wedding takes place.		
eternal light	A light that is always burning as a symbol of God's presence.		
ketubah	A marriage contract which says what the bride and groom promise to each other.		
kosher	Special rules about what foods Jewish people can eat and the way they are prepared.		
mazel tov	A Hebrew phrase which means good fortune or congratulations.

memorial boards	Boards which contain the names of people who have died.	<p>What is the Shema? The Shema is the most important prayer in Judaism. It is said twice a day and reminds Jews to follow the Ten Commandments. It is written inside a mezuzah and placed on the front door in Jewish homes.</p>	<p>What happens at a Jewish Wedding?</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The bride and groom will fast on the day of the wedding. - The groom places a veil over the bride's face. - The bride walks around the Chuppah with her father 7 times. - The groom gives the bride a gold ring. - The bride and groom sign the 'ketubah.' - The Rabbi blesses the couple. - The ceremony ends with the groom stamping on a glass and the guests shouting 'Mazel Tov.'
mezuzah	A parchment inside a case that is placed on the front door.	<p>What is Yom Kippur? Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year for Jewish people. It is the day Jewish people ask God for forgiveness for the things they have done wrong over the year. The day is spent at the Synagogue praying.</p>	
Siddur	A prayer book	<p>What do Jewish people eat? Jewish people follow certain rules about what they eat. The food they eat must be Kosher.</p>	
synagogue	The Jewish place of worship		
Ten Commandments	A set of rules given to Moses by God.		
veil	A piece of thin material.		
yad	A pointer used to read the Torah.
